This talk will look at some key 5th and 6th century Saxon burial and settlement sites in the county, along with documents, chance finds and new genetic research in an attempt to piece together the birth of the kingdom of Sussex. Recent discoveries by Imperial College London, operating from Littlehampton, have now been able to draw a picture of "what leaving Europe" meant in times past.

They will include a brief background to CAP as well and some initial thoughts about how this 1st to 4th century settlement fits into the wider context of southeast Britain in the Roman period and why it qualified for earthwork defences during the late 2nd century.
